**Meeting called to order at 7:38 by Jim Locke**

**Introduction of guests Brian Lowe and John Abbott from SST were guests at the meeting to explain the corporate shoot.**

**Laura Ballard gave the Treasurers Report. John Thimmesch made a motion to accept, Marion Dukes 2nd.**

**SST (Seattle Skeet and Trap) have been putting these shoots on the last couple of years. They had a group of 43 people that wanted to come this Saturday and they were unable to accommodate them. This comes out to \$70 per person, total cost ammo, food and targets. Brian explained the corporate event and how it will work. They pointed out pitfalls and ideas to make the shoot a success. One of the biggest challenges is to get everyone done at the same time.**

**There was general discussion around Action shooting.**

**We need a preservative for the glulam soon so that we can make sure the rains don't cause a problem.**

**Nothing new on the roof.**

**New tractor mentioned.**

**Mike Sumner will look to make sure that our current insurance will cover the tractor or find out what we need to do to ensure that our tractor is covered by insurance.**

**Women's pistol class for July 15, 7 women are confirmed for the class. Jim just talked to two more from Seattle plus possibly two more. We have two women in August right now.**

**Insights class went really well. We need to get the bill from Jack. Insights check will be coming to the club. Insights did a really good job cleaning up the range.**

**It is only 3 months to sight in days. We need to order some targets. Need to get the flyer together. We need to establish dates and be sure that we are ready for sight in days. Some discussion about spotting scopes. Some discussion around how we are going to handle scopes. Need at least 5 scopes. Bill Davis is going to look into scopes. We need to begin advertising Sight In days in the Bullsheet and on the website. The dates that we are looking at for this years Sight In days is September 22, 23, 29, 30 and October 6, 7.**

**John Griffin has been approached for certified hunters safety instructors. There must be 10 in the class for them to come out and teach the class at the club. Class would be Friday night and Saturday. Please contact John Griffin if you would like to be in this class.**

**Discussion between Steve Reinhart and Jim Locke and looked at the meat shed. We could toss a lot of what is in there and turn the building into storage and a workshop for making targets and other things that we need to make.**

**Bill Davis turned over the quote to Steve Reinhart and we're going to begin work on the lower range. Bill is going to talk to Steve about the container. Jim will take care of seeing to it so that the gravel is down rest the container on.**

**Due to the possibility of accidents, we need to ensure that anyone using the tractor is a certified tractor operator.**

**Jim Locke brought up that there are clubs that are being forced to close earlier for noise control. He thinks that we should put together a letter and host a "meet and greet" at our clubs for other clubs and gun shops that will allow everyone to get together, get to know each other and come up with ideas to find out what their concerns and ideas are so that we can best control the situation in the future.**

**We are always getting the same volunteers at the club. There is a lot to do at the club and we need people to step up and volunteer to help out now and then. There was discussion about raising rates or, if you volunteer a specific amount of time, you can continue to pay the old rate. At this point, we can't lower the price to be in the club, but we would like more people to volunteer time at the club.**

## **READ ABOUT OUR TRAINING AND ACTION SHOOTING FACILITY**

Questions have been floated about the Club's decision to go ahead with development of an action shooting facility. These questions, along with a lot of partial- and mis-information, need to be addressed. BDGC's Action Shooting Committee recognizes the need for more and better communications about this project, so, at our April General Meeting, an extensive presentation was made to address these issues and to answer any questions.

We had a good number attending that night, but for those members who couldn't make the April meeting, here is a recap.

Guests at the meeting included two members of the Northwest Practical Pistol Association (NWPPA), Sandy Wylie and Robb Wolfe. Sandy also serves as the Northwest Coordinator for the International Defensive Pistol Association (IDPA) and Robb is a Board Member at Renton Fish & Game Club. Sandy and Robb were asked to come to the meeting and assure the accuracy of materials we presented and the answers we gave.

### **BACKGROUND**

With urbanization creeping toward our property, BDGC must adapt if we are to survive over the long term. We have to show that we are filling a community need. If not, as has happened to many shooting ranges, "The Community" will decide they have no need for us!

Within the urban sprawl we have identified an opportunity - a growing contingent of new shooters! Good indicators of this are the growth of indoor shooting ranges and the amount of money people spend at them. Indoor range activity means handguns; apparently these suburban shooters are looking for a place to practice with the pistols and revolvers they keep in the home or carry. BDGC's own range logs show more handgun calibers than rifle - 9mm, .40 S&W, .45 ACP and .38/357.

People are looking for a place to shoot their handguns!

More important, the success of our own Basic Handgun Classes for Women is proof that many of these same folks want a place to learn more about shooting - and they are willing to spend good money learn!

### **ACTION SHOOTING SPORTS, TRAINING and REVENUES**

Your Board of Trustees was presented last year with the idea of Cowboy Action Shooting. This hugely popular activity draws large numbers of paying shooters. Ranges that host monthly Cowboy Shoots will see forty or more shooters for a one-day event, all willing to pay a \$20.00 entry fee or more.

If we did this, every Cowboy Action match would require the shutdown of regular operations on our upper rifle and pistol line. A suggestion was made that perhaps that a part of our lower range could be adapted for this use. There would be space for several shooting bays that could be used when the trap fields aren't operating.

The idea of multiple, short-range shooting bays led to discussion of other possible uses and revenue sources.

First to mind was training - particularly law-enforcement training. Not only could we move those activities off the upper range, we could provide expanded capabilities for more and larger contracts. Commercial training is also an opportunity - at least one firearms training organization has already committed to a new contract with us if such a facility is built. Contracts like these are good revenue sources for our Club, but equally important, they establish us a *Community Resource!*

### **Training and Action Shooting Facility (cont.)**

Other action sports would use the same shooting bays - many ranges run Cowboy Action, Defensive Pistol, Practical Shooting and other related activities on different weekends in the same

shooting bays. United States Practical Shooting Association (USPSA) and International Defensive Pistol Association (IDPA) both have large followings in the Puget Sound area and their shooters are clamoring for more places to shoot.

With the possibility of a multi-bay shooting facility in mind, BDGC's infant group of Action Shooters investigated the revenue possibilities.

Among the three opportunities, Cowboy Shooting would likely bring the highest attendance figures. Cowboy matches are the most equipment-intensive, however, and would likely require a longer start-up period. Practical Shooting is less equipment-intensive and might be a quicker start-up than Cowboy Shooting. But, for the individual shooter, start-up costs can be high – "IPSC" guns and gear are awfully specialized and not cheap. And IPSC-style matches are less than inviting to new shooters as well.

Defensive Pistol – IDPA – shooting is the least equipment-intensive of the three choices and would be the quickest start-up. Ranges need the least amount of equipment and shooters can usually compete with equipment they already own and use for defensive purposes. Matches in the Puget Sound area typically draw a minimum 10 to 20 shooters per shooting bay and charge ten to fifteen dollars entry fee per shooter.

Renton Fish & Game Club provides up to seven action bays (as we will). They host all three of the described sports and Robb Wolfe verified the following facts about attendance and revenues.

IDPA matches at Renton are hosted by NWPPA (Northwest Practical Pistol Assn). NWPPA charges an entry fee of \$15 per shooter and they run their matches on five dollars of that – the remaining \$10.00 is paid, under contract, to Renton Fish & Game Club. (Yes, that's *ten dollars per shooter*, free and clear to the Renton Club!)

IDPA matches at Renton – one Saturday a month – draw an average of 45 to 50 shooters. Last January, 83 shooters showed up! Robb and Sandy both agree that Black Diamond has the opportunity to draw the same numbers.

In BDGC's case, there will be no third party involved. Our Club will be the hosting organization and no part of the registration fees will be paid out to anyone. Each shooter's fifteen dollars will be paid into BDGC's treasury.

Fees? Yes, as Sandy Wylie confirmed, BDGC will pay the National IDPA Headquarters an affiliation fee in order to hold sanctioned matches - \$50.00 a year!

Prizes? Sandy also explained that IDPA-sanctioned matches bring trophies and Award Certificates to top shooters – no prizes, cash, merchandise or otherwise are endorsed or approved by the International Defensive Pistol Association.

Equipment costs? Our distributed operating costs per IDPA shooter will be approximately \$6.00 each for our first 12 months and will decline as initial costs are amortized. The complete operating budget for our IDPA matches, like all the Club's finances, is not open to the general public and won't be detailed here. It is available for review by any BDGC member.

In summary, just one activity, one day a month, on our on our new Training and Action Shooting Facility will bring Black Diamond Gun Club a net income of \$300 or more a month.

*...and one more positive step in Community Involvement!*

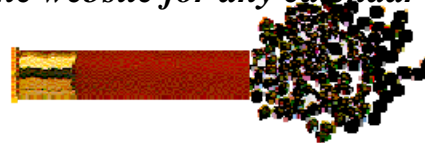

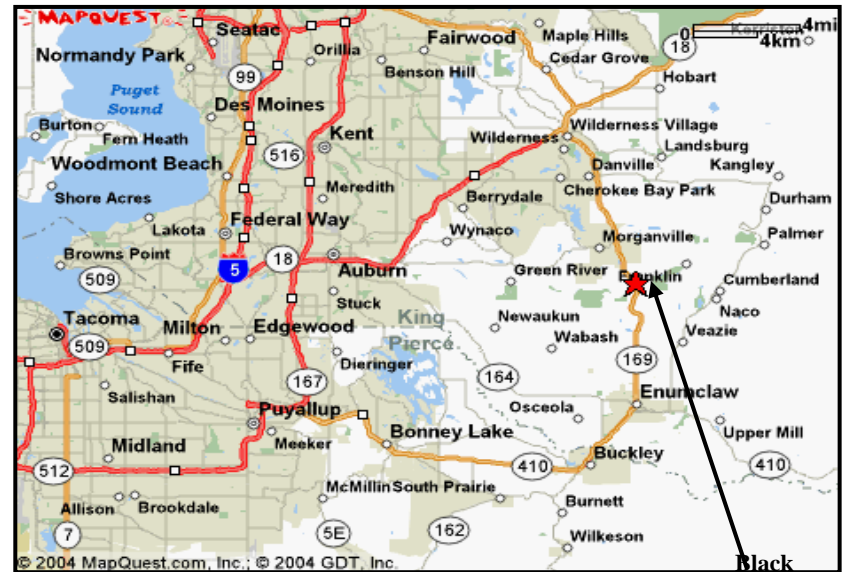
